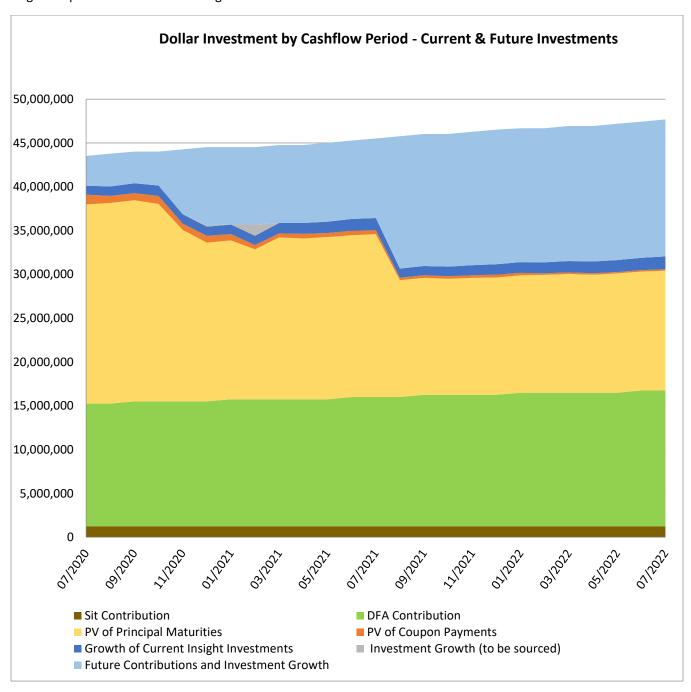

Notes

The seventh cash flow for 2020 from the liquidity program was completed on July 23rd. The actuarial model cash flow was slightly higher than actual experience, producing \$81 thousand more than the actual benefits paid.

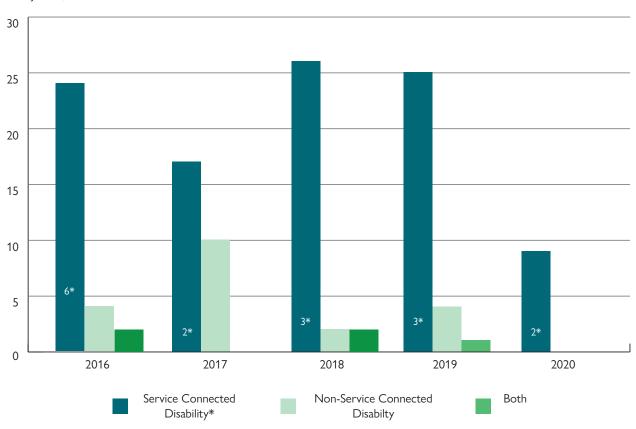

As of June 30, 2020

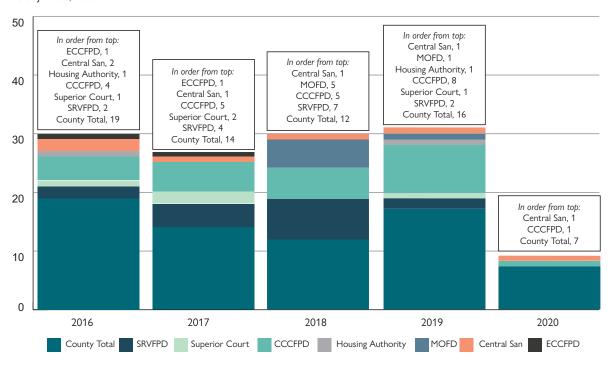
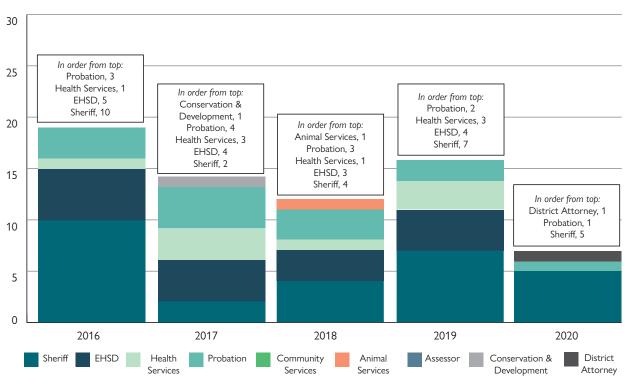


Exhibit 3: Total Disability Applications Filed with CCCERA (by County Department)

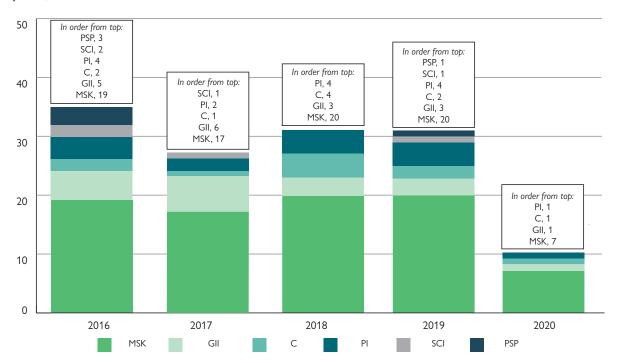

The following acronyms group different illnesses together by type to show trends and are not limited to the examples below.

Musculoskeletal (MSK)	Will include all orthopedic injuries and illness. Examples include carpal tunnel syndrome, amputation, avascular necrosis, back injury, degenerative disc disease, fibromyalgia, lumbar stenosis, neck injury, shoulder injury, and disc herniation.
General Internal Incapacitation (GII)	Will include all injuries and illness that are general non-orthopedic issues, not covered by the noted above. Examples include diabetes, any disease or injury to an internal organ, rheumatology, pulmonary, gastrointestinal.
Cancer (C)	Will include all permanent incapacitation that was the result of a form of cancer.
Psychiatric Incapacitation (PI)	Will include all psychiatric and mental health conditions and injuries. Examples would be PTSD, OCD, depression, schizophrenia, anxiety disorders, mood and emotional disorders.
Severe Cognitive Impairment (SCI)	Will include all illness' and injuries where the incapacitation has caused diminished cognitive function. Examples include traumatic brain injury, dementia, dyslexia, dyscalculia, memory impairments, diminished concentration and speech.
Public Safety Presumptions (PSP)	Will include all illness and injuries where the cause is governed under GC Sections 31720.5, 31720.6, 31720.7, or 31720.9. Presumptions will be listed twice; once under total presumption and once under type of disability.
Unknown (UKN)	Disability application filed for unknown medical reasons. An example would be an employer that filed an application with limited medical records due to HIPAA.

Subject: Review of 2020 CCCERA budget versus actual expenses mid-year report

Background

Enclosed please find a budget versus actuals expense update report for the 2020 fiscal year from January 1 through June 30, 2020. The 2020 budget is presented as a total annual amount in order to compare with actual expenses through mid-year. The remaining budget dollars and percentages of budget remaining allows the reader to compare and monitor how much is left for the remaining fiscal year. The update is divided into three sections including: Total CCCERA departments combining Administrative and Non-Administrative expenses (p.1), followed by separate Total Administrative (p.2) and Total Non-Administrative expense sections (p.3).

Administrative departmental expenses include Executive, Compliance, Administrative/ HR, Accounting, Information Technology, Retirement Services, and Member Services. Non-Administrative expenses include Investments and Legal, along with any other departmental legal fees, and Disaster Recovery program costs.

For the mid-year status ended June 30, 2020; total CCCERA expenses amounted to \$7,866,031 of which \$5,652,139 was Administrative and \$2,213,892 was Non-Administrative. Administrative expenses when compared to the 2020 approved Administrative budget of \$11,781,000 results in a remaining budget of \$6,128,861, or 52% left at the 50% mid-year point.

Section 31580.2 of the California Government Code sets a statutory limit for administrative expenses to be capped at 0.21% of the most current Actuarial Accrued Liability (AAL). Last measured as of December 31, 2018, the AAL is \$9,682,143,750 which results in a statutory limit of approximately \$20.3 million. The 2020 Administrative expenses are trending at \$11.3 million for year-end which is 0.117% of the AAL and well under the limit amount.

Subject: Consider and take possible action to authorize the CEO to extend the Brown

Armstrong auditing services contract.

Background

At the January 10, 2018 Board meeting, on the recommendation of the audit committee, the Board authorized the CEO to execute a contract with Brown Armstrong for auditing services for the three year period for the years ending December 31, 2017, 2018, and 2019 with the option to renew for another three years, subject to the annual review and recommendation of the audit committee. At the August 26, 2020 audit committee meeting, the audit committee discussed a possible contract extension for Brown Armstrong.

Brown Armstrong provided a proposal that will freeze fees for the next three years at the same rate as 2019 and exclude any travel costs separately to be billed only on an as-needed basis. The GASB 68 reporting fees are allocated to employers based on a pro rata share.
